A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Yesterday (Saturday) was the feast day of St. May Magdalene.

It is a big day. The Pope loves Mary Magdalene. Many saints love Mary Magdalene.

Why?

Because everybody has a little Mary Magdalene in them.

Mary Magdalene lived a tough life. She made some serious mistakes. Deep down inside her, there was some real need for healing.

But Mary Magdalene knew where to go for that healing. In fact, she became one of the Lord's best friends and most devout followers.

Why? Because as the scriptures say, the one who had been forgiven much, loves much. Mary Magdalene loved the Lord very much because she knew the depths of her depravity. She knew the depths of the wickedness that resided within her. She knew she needed help.

But she also knew that Jesus knew about that wickedness inside of her. She knew that he was completely aware of it and loved her just the same. She knew that there was forgiveness for her even beyond whatever evil might have been inside her.

And that made her very, very, very loyal. She was so loyal to Jesus because, in spite of her undeservedness, he was even more loyal to her.

The lesson for us is never to run from the evil inside. (p.s. it is there). We never have to run from it but rather it should be the occasion to love God more, who wipes away our sin when we go to him seeking help to change.

Obviously people go wrong when they say, 'because God loves me so much and accepts who I am, I could do whatever I want.' That is obviously ridiculous. After all, Mary Magdalene stopped the sins she was committing. Otherwise it would have been presumption of God's mercy.

But it is right for us to say, 'because God loves me so much, I would never want to betray that love by returning to any type of life or activity that He does not accept.' These words characterize the sentiments of Mary Magdalene as evidenced by her change in lifestyle subsequent to her encounter with God's mercy.

Mary Magdalene is hope for a world in need. Is there anyone who cannot relate to St. Mary Magdalene?
