A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

This past Wednesday we celebrated the feast day of St. Vincent de Paul. St. Vincent is the Patron Saint of our Diocese, the Diocese of Richmond. There is a beautiful statue of him in the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart.

St. Vincent was a great saint dedicated to service to those in need. His love for God and his recognition of the blessings and gifts God had bestowed on him during his life, especially the gifts of heaven and salvation given through Christ, impelled him in his work.

He has a beautiful quote that talks about his service to the poor, about how they are often unkind to him and the stretch his patience greatly, but rather than quit or get frustrated and go and do something else, he doesn't. In fact, based on all he accomplished, it would seem that in spite of likely feeling those sentiments regularly, he never gave into them. Rather he reminded himself to be thankful for what he was given, and carried on in the work.

Thankfulness is essential for keeping the love of God alive in our hearts. No matter what, we have to look to God and be thankful for what He has done in our lives. And the more we grow as Christians, that thankfulness has to come more and more from invisible things rather than visible things (grace, mercy, heaven, communion with the saints...rather than homes, cars, even health).

Saints were thankful people. Sometimes I think we might have it a little too good, materially speaking, and we have to invent problems. After all, cable news is on 24 hours a day and they have to fill the time with something. There can be a tendency to create problems because I think we as humans get bored with being thankful. It's just like a kid with a ton of toys who says "mom, I'm bored, there's nothing to do." Unfortunately it's not just kids who do this.

So whatever is going on, there is much to be thankful for. Here is much to thank God for. It's important that we thank Him, as it is what is going to impel us, like it did St. Vincent, to continue to be a force for the good. Every single person is called to be a saint. God wants us to reach our full potential.
