#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

It is very important that we demand that our elected officials guarantee our religious freedom. St Paul knows the importance of religious freedom as he writes in the second reading this Sunday that we should offer "prayers...for kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity."

Religion is a very powerful force. It demands the highest level of obedience. Therefore, governments have always, since the beginning of government, sought to either stomp our religion or control it for themselves, because when people have religion they are harder to control due to their allegiance to something other than (and higher than) the government.

Religious freedom is a relatively new idea in the timeline of human history. It is also something that must be continually fought to keep as the status quo here. There will always be the temptation for government to remove or try to stomp down religious freedom. This is because government, even democracies, tend to always collect and accumulate greater power, and in doing so tend to demote or limit other centers of power. The size of our government as a percent of the size of our county's economy has grown over 400% in the last 120 years!!! It is becoming more and more in control of everything that happens in the country, and control doesn't like outside threats.

Be vigilant. Pray for "kings and for all in authority, that we may lead a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity." Express your disgust at politicians who want to tell Catholics how to live or what to believe. Reject their desire to control our hospitals, schools, or other agencies. If we give them control, we will never get it back.-- Fr. Rossi

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT - I wanted to inform you of something very unfortunate that happened in one of our parishes. While cleaning the church, we found a host laying on the floor in the pews. It is likely that it was a consecrted host that someone walked back totheir pew with and threw on the floor. This is a sacrilege and if done willingly is grounds for excommunication from the Church. Desecration of the Blessed Sacrament is one of the worst offences that can be committed because it is an offence against the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. I pray it was simply an accident and maybe a child who did not know what they were doing. EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION - if you are privileged enough to be able to help with the distribution of Holy Communion, then you need to observe every single person who comes up for Communion to be sure they consume the Host in front of you. No one is ever permitted to walk off with the Host. If they do, you need to stop them and ask them to either return the Host to you or consume it in front of you. I do this regularly and you need to as well if you want to have the honored responsibility of distributing Holy Communion. ALL PARISHIONERS - if you see someone walking away with a Host or someone in the pew with a Host then you need to say something to them. Do not be ashamed. Or walk up to the priest at that moment (not at the end of Mass) and tell the priest so he can deal with it. We must take it extremely seriously to care for and protect the Blessed Sacrament and it is everyone's responsibility. Thank you – Fr. Rossi
