Weekly Reflection

"I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction." In the second reading, Saint Paul gets to the root of some of our modern difficulties: intentions and distractions. Despite a lot of good will and effort, we can be distracted by all the "shiny" things in our lives from our vocations and the ways in which the Lord regularly wants to speak with us. You get married, or you get ordained, and no sooner than you set yourself to your vocation your mind can wander,

and you find yourself wondering if you made the right choice and your express regret.

Say "No!" to all of that.

Instead, remember the Lord calls where you are tight now, in the life that you live today. How will you unite with him, in your marriage, your family, your situations, whatever it is, however it looks? Be "anxious" which really means here in Saint Paul, to be focused, about what is before you and dig deep. That will be the place of sanctity for you. Those who are unmarried – be concerned about the Lord for the sake of others. Those who are married – be concerned about the Lord through your spouse and our children.

Opportunities for Fellowship & Service

We have Friday Fish Frys at St John and the possibility of Soup Suppers on Wednesdays, following Vespers at St Patrick during the Season of Lent. All proceeds are contributed to continuing opportunities for fellowship and for general parish needs.

Holy Week 2024

We're solidifying plans for liturgical celebrations for Lent (right around the corner) and Holy Week. For Lent, we are adding Vespers and various additional opportunities for Confession. Presently, we are considering continuing the 3pm Good Friday Liturgy at Saint Peter (with Confessions available 12noon-3pm), but eliminating the celebrations of Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil at Saint Peter only. Saint Patrick would maintain its past schedule and celebrations would be: 6pm Holy Thursday, 7pm Good Friday, 7:30pm Easter Vigil. At Saint John, we would offer: 7pm Holy Thursday, 7pm Good Friday, 7:30pm Easter Vigil – attention would be focused on the Hispanic community, recognizing that most of those coming into the Church are Spanish-speaking. Easter Sunday would be regular Sunday schedule within the cluster. Again, we are having conversations, please reach out to me directly with ideas and concerns, the solidified liturgical schedule will come out shortly -Fr Capuano: bcapuano@richmondcluster.org

I'm basically to the point where I want to block the church from overnight stays, due to the immense difficulty in cleaning up the lot each morning, through significant effort and time offered by John Thornton and some key volunteers on Wednesdays, not to mention Kris' morning routine bleaching the doorstep to the office. Presently the marble for all three of the features is behind the sanctuary in a pile.
