Thank you for your patience with the bulletin and weekly emails. The last couple of weeks, I have had to resend emails for the bulletin, because of ommisions and oversights *on my part*. I apologize for my errors. No one needs more emails... I'm still learning how to "see" the media and technology in a way that will streamline our office efforts to communicate effectively. If you are frustrated, take it out on me, the bulletin layout and weekly emails are my creation, I take full ownership of the problems.

This week we head into the most solemn week of the liturgical year. This is an opportunity for you to enter deeply into the Mysteries of the Lord's Life, Death, and Resurrection. Holy Thursday is a focus on the institution of the Sacred Priesthood and the institution of the Most Holy Eucharist. #### Simple Ways to Leave a Legacy Gift

One of the simplest ways to leave a gift to our church is to use the beneficiary designation on savings and retirement accounts, as well as life insurance policies. These can be done with no cost, and typically only require us to sign a new beneficiary designation form.

Retirement assets and similar accounts are called Income in Respect of a Decedent (IRD) assets. This is taxable income that's earned during life but not received before death, so it is never included in an income tax return. This may be assets in Individual Retirement Accounts or 403(b) plans, accrued interest on Certificates of Deposit and savings bonds, non-qualified stock options, deferred payments of capital gains, or other income that is earned but not acquired.

In most cases, naming the church as the beneficiary of these types of assets gives the estate and heirs the best tax benefits, since it avoids both income and estate taxes.

**UPDATE:** Statue in honor of Frank Parater. We've had a couple people reach out offering gifts to help fund a statue of Frank Parater - thank you! I'm currently working with the vendor who constructed the bronze statue at Benedictine. I'm also working with a vendor who is supporting the restoration of the plaster statues at Saint Peter. A general estimate is a little over \$3000 for a fiberglass statue, which is consistent with new statues, as companies have moved away from crafting in plaster. The idea is to model the colors and texture of the statue on the current statues in the Church. More to come, lots more planning is necessary; thank you for your interest and generosity. 

#### CLUSTER NEWS

Easter Food Basket Blessing. The Christian significance of Easter is symbolized in the items used and foods chosen for this special Easter tradition. Baskets are lined with a white cloth and filled with foods that will be eaten on Easter Sunday. Lastly, the basket is covered with white cloth, to symbolize the shroud in which Christ's body was wrapped.

Traditionally, the baskets are filled with: decorated hardboiled eggs (representing Christ's Resurrection); lamb-shaped butter or sugar (representing Christ as the "Lamb of God"); bread (reminding us that Jesus is the "Bread of Life"); meats, such as ham (symbolic of great joy and abundance), sausage (symbolic of God's favor and generosity), smoked bacon (symbolic of the overabundance of God's mercy), or lamb (representing Christ as the "Lamb of God"); salt (symbolic of prosperity and justice, and reminding us that we are "the salt of the earth"); cheese (symbolizing the moderation Christians should have at all times); horseradish, pepper, oil, and vinegar (symbolic of the Passion of Christ and the bitter herbs of the Passover); and wine (symbolic of the Blood of the Lord).

This long-honored tradition is both deeply symbolic and Bible Study. We will be holding a Bible Study beginning delightfully heart-warming. Children are eager to help prepare and decorate the family basket and proudly carry it into the church on Holy Saturday for the blessing. or other treats to be blessed.

## Good Friday, March 29th

According to ancient tradition, Mass is forbidden on this day. Instead, there is a Liturgy of the Word, adoration of the Most Holy Cross and distribution of Holy Communion
