#### THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PASTOR

We have a couple of Holy Days of Obligation coming up: the Solemnities of All Saints (Friday, November 1st) and the Immaculate Conception (Monday, December 9th).

Why does the Church ask that we prioritize these feasts and "make us come to Mass" outside of Sunday?

Whether we like it or not, we are all "modern." In an earlier age, Feast days were civic holidays, something far different than "bank holidays," as experienced in the US today, where we might have a day off and can purchase appliances and vehicles at a reduced rate. In the past, certain feasts, helped us mark our identity and draw us closer to the Lord and one another; they were corporate days of rest.

For Church workers, they are in fact "more work," and there is a real "burden" on the rest of the faithful, given the "work day" and other responsibilities.

As we approach these feasts, what if we treated them differently in our own spiritual lives?

This year, on November 1st, I have the honor of attending the first vows of a young religious, Sister Mary, Queen of All Hearts, a *Servidora* Sister, who is a former student of mine from Petersburg. I have had the opportunity of serving her and her family for a number of years and have been welcomed into a renewed sense of what it means to be a Christian. As we hear from Joshua: "as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." This family has provided me with a kind of "reset" to how I approach the Lord, the Church, and the world. Dear Sister Mary reminds me that we are here to consecrate our hearts for the world to come. Indeed, religious life is a unique expression in the life of the Church, it shows forth the nuptial union that we all hope for in Christ for eternal life.

The Feast of All Saints is a simple reminder that we live in a much bigger world than the burdens of the day. The Feast of the Immaculate Conception is a simple reminder that a "youthful YES" to Our Lord can bring healing and holiness to souls and participate in the redemption of the world.

Let's be bold and sacrifice this year and choose the Lord.

Please be assured of my prayers this week.

Se acercan un par de días festivos de precepto: las solemnidades de Todos los Santos (viernes 1 de noviembre) y la Inmaculada Concepción (lunes 9 de diciembre).

¿Por qué la Iglesia nos pide que prioricemos estas fiestas y "nos haga venir a misa" fuera del domingo?

Nos guste o no, todos somos "modernos". En una época anterior, los días festivos eran feriados cívicos, algo muy diferente a los "feriados bancarios", como los que se viven en los Estados Unidos hoy, donde podemos tener un día libre y comprar electrodomésticos y vehículos a un precio reducido. En el pasado, ciertas fiestas nos ayudaban a marcar nuestra identidad y acercarnos al Señor y a los demás; eran días corporativos de descanso.

Para los trabajadores de la Iglesia, de hecho "es más trabajo", y hay una verdadera "carga" para el resto de los fieles, dada la "jornada laboral" y otras responsabilidades.

Al acercarnos a estas fiestas, ¿qué pasaría si las tratáramos de manera diferente en nuestra propia vida espiritual?

Este año, el 1 de noviembre, tendré el honor de asistir a los primeros votos de una joven religiosa, la Hermana Mary, Reina de todos los corazones, una hermana Servidora, que es una ex alumna mía de Petersburgo. He tenido la oportunidad de servirla a ella y a su familia durante varios años y he sido acogido con un renovado sentido de lo que significa ser cristiana. Como escuchamos de Joshua: "en cuanto a mí y a mi casa, serviremos al Señor". Esta familia me ha proporcionado una especie de "reinicio" en mi manera de acercarme al Señor, a la Iglesia y al mundo. La querida Hermana Mary me recuerda que estamos aquí para consagrar nuestros corazones para el mundo venidero. De hecho, la vida religiosa es una expresión única en la vida de la Iglesia, muestra la unión nupcial que todos esperamos en Cristo para la vida eterna.

La Fiesta de Todos los Santos es un simple recordatorio de que vivimos en un mundo mucho más grande que las cargas del día. La Fiesta de la Inmaculada Concepción es un simple recordatorio de que un "SÍ juvenil" a Nuestro Señor puede traer sanación y santidad a las almas y participar en la redención del mundo.

Seamos valientes y sacrifiquemos este año y elijamos al Señor.

Tengan la seguridad de que esta semana los acompañaré en mis oraciones.

#### A Note from the Pastor/ Una nota de el pastor

#### **Sound System**

A week ago, I met with our sound engineers to begin conversations about updating the systems at Saint Patrick and Saint John.

At Saint Patrick: We will receive bids to update the front speakers, as well as the monitors in the back, the pulpit microphone and the other technology necessary to support the system. The system in the hall will remain the same.

At Saint John: We will receive bids with options to replace the speakers in the church, the sound board, a plan for moving the choir, updated microphones for the pulpit and choir and a cleaner, less cluttered arrangement for the newly placed choir, once we are prepared to move forward with the interior updates.

Various projects and endeavors around the community: We're continuing the statue restoration project at Saint Peter and looking for assistance in cleaning the marble and restoring the altar rail and fixing the baptismal font (along with its relocation to is early 1900s location in the nave of the Church, all with the blessing of the Bishop. At Saint Patrick, we're working on bids to restore the front doors of the Church, and in the midst of a design for a dedicated confessional and we're beginning to get bids to repair the exterior and interior doors of the Church (as well as finalizing the refurbishment of the apartment we purchased a little over a year ago. At Saint John, I received the first set of draft renderings of the scope of work for the interior renewal of the Church. Last week, I submitted recommendations for tweaking the design.

I hope to present photos of the statue repair progress, sketches for the confessional and interior of the Saint John sanctuary soon. In regard to new work in the Churches, outside of basic repairs, my intention is always to pray, consult with staff and with the parish(es) at-large, reflect, and pray some more, and then make a decision on how to proceed. I'm always available to share what I'm thinking and have no intention of trying to force an agenda. I'm not a fan of campaigns, I'm more of a "pay-as-you-go" kind of guy. I'm grateful for your generosity and commitment to our parishes. Let's keep praying and working for the Lord. - Fr. Capuano

#### MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

As we approach the upcoming Solemnities of All Saints Day (Nov. 1), Christ the King Sunday (Nov. 24), Immaculate Conception (Dec. 9, trans.), and the celebrations of Christmas, we end one liturgical calendar cycle and begin a new one with Advent. Before the end of this liturgical calendar year, we recall the faith and witness that the Saints gave to our Faith. It is helpful to recall how the Saints worshipped God, while here on earth and put our own perspective of Sacred Music and liturgical practices into the context of the broader Church history, rather than just within our lifetime. From the time of Saint Jerome (4th c.), the church has utilized latin as the primary language in which to worship God. It is, in part, for this reason that the Second Vatican Council addresses the continuance of the singing of latin in the Mass Ordinary when it says, "Steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them." The vernacular language of the people is also important to the council fathers, but Sacrosanctum Concilium (1963) seems to be clear, at least in reference to the Ordinary of the Mass, that latin ought to be preserved.

As a brief aside, this Thursday, we will celebrate the All



As a brief aside, this Thursday, we will celebrate the All Hallows Eve Vigil at Saint Patrick, followed by a procession around the block. Much of the service will be in latin, however, if latin is a new language to sing or speak, I encourage you to attend! Sing along with the parts that are in english and/or are familiar to you, then openly and actively listen to the latin parts, remembering that active participation is an inward and outward sign of worship to God. There will be translations of the latin in the program, so to invite us all to pray through the words.

#### Próximos días de precepto


