#### THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXION SEMANAL DEL PASTOR

Christ did not enter into a sanctuary made by hands... The letter to the Hebrews may be a bit of a stretch for us to connect to today. That's OK. We're not living in a culture that is oriented to worship and a culture of sacrifice that was more familiar to an earlier age.

Why should we care?

Simply put, in the Creed we pray that we believe in a world visible and invisible. Each of us have at least one guardian angel and all of us have patron saints to turn to for assistance. Maybe it seems strange, maybe we feel as though we are talking to ourselves. Please, take it from me, as a priest, we deal with "strange goings-on" all... the... time... There is more to "this world" than we would normally feel comfortable admitting.

## Music at Saint Patrick & Saint John

There is something to be learned about generosity and our approach to Church music from the Gospel this Sunday. Jesus points out to his disciples that the widow puts all she has, in her poverty, into the treasury at the Temple. Not only are we called to give monetarily to further the mission of Christ through the Church, but we are called to give our whole selves. This is especially true in worship. In planning the music for Mass and other liturgical ceremonies, it is important to consider what the Church teaches on the subject (ex. use of the latin language in the liturgy is to be preserved; care ought to be taken for the people to sing the Ordinary together; etc.) as well as to introduce new music to congregations in an incremental manner, so to continue to encourage the participation of the people, and thus, the ability of the Faithful to give our whole selves. Learning new music that is sung at Mass, singing the music we have known and loved our who lives, and praying internally through music at Mass, bring glory to God gives His honor.

# **Holy Day Schedule**

You may have noticed a change in the Holy Day/special celebration Mass Schedule. Why are we scheduling Masses in English and Spanish in a new format? 1) part of it is due to my schedule in the Bishop's office; 2) part of it is to encourage parishioners to benefit from various Masses throughout the city at a time and language that works for their schedule; 3) part of it is to provide Mass in English and Spanish, where appropriate, so that folks know that Mass is in one language or another.
