FROM THE PASTOR**The Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King on November 24, 2024.**

November 15-23, the nine days preceding the Solemnity, let us offer our prayers to Christ the King for the freedom of the Church. This is being encouraged by all the Bishops of the United States, in light all of the social and political efforts to influence our free practice of the Faith.

We will hold Eucharistic Processions at Saint John (9:00 AM Mass), Saint Patrick (10:45 AM Mass) and at Saint John (12:30 PM Mass) on Sunday, November 24.

The annual Solemnity of Christ the King, in the modern calendar, closes out the liturgical year and reminds us that The Lord Jesus Christ is King of the Universe, of all of creation. Pope Benedict, reminds us in his reflections of the life of Our Lord, that Eucharistic Processions are images of the faithful accompanying the Triumphant Paschal Lamb out into the world. Our presence, even simply, in the community, accompanying our Lord is a giant sign of contradiction to the age that seems to suggest that we need only our own resources and our own “truth” in order to navigate the world. As Christians we proclaim we are sheep of the flock, members of the body, sons and daughters of the *only* King. Please join us in giving a healthy Christian witness at the various Masses where we will offer exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a simple procession, and Benediction to follow.

In anticipation of the Feast of Christ the King, we would like to have some assistance with the processions immediately after Mass at Saint John and Saint Patrick - carrying the canopy and helping direct the faithful along the procession route. We will also need at least 2 servers for each Mass. If you can assist, please contact Fr. Capuano.

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

As we end the season of Ordinary Time—the time after Pentecost—we approach the season of Advent. On the third Sunday of Advent this year—also known as Gaudete, or Rejoice, Sunday—the choirs of Sts. John and Patrick will offer a liturgical service of Nine Lessons and Carols. As the name suggests, the service includes nine lessons (scriptural readings) and nine carols (hymns and choral pieces of music), incrementally bringing us through the season of Advent into the season of Christmas. The first few readings focus on the fall and original sin in Genesis, then transition to the promise of a Savior in Isaiah, and finally bring us to the story of the birth of Jesus in various Gospel accounts. Each carol that follows is meant to be a musical meditation on the reading that preceded. There will be some carols sung by the congregation and some sung by the choir alone. We hope you will join us for this musical and scriptural reflection of the seasons of Advent and Christmas, as we prepare for the coming of Our Lord.

Novena, Mass and Celebration: Honoring Our Lady of Guadalupe. Did you know that Our Lady of Guadalupe is a celebration that reaches far beyond Mexico? While she is deeply cherished in Mexico, her influence extends across the entire Americas. In 1754, Pope Benedict XIV declared her the patroness of "New Spain" (which included much of Central and Northern America), and in 1946, Pope Pius XII named her the "Patroness of the Americas" and "Queen of Mexico and Empress of the Americas." She holds a special place in the hearts of Catholics across the continent.

To honor her, we will begin a **Novena at St. John's**, starting on December 3rd and continuing through December 11th. Then, on **December 12th**, we'll come together to celebrate the Apparition of Our Lady of Guadalupe to St. Juan Diego—a powerful moment that reminds us of Mary's deep love for each of us and the love we are called to show her.

Join us for **Mass at 7:00 PM on December 12th**, followed by a festive celebration. This is a wonderful opportunity to give thanks for her intercession and celebrate her feast day as the Patroness of the Americas. Everyone is welcome—whether you're from Mexico or anywhere in the Americas, this celebration is for all of us! Come and be part of this joyful, meaningful occasion as we celebrate Mary's love and protection over our community.
