The first weekend of February (Feb 1-2), the usual Sunday in Ordinary Time is superseded this year by the Feast of the Presentation, also known as Candlemas. Traditionally, the Feast of the Presentation is the conclusion of the Christmas season. Candles are blessed to symbolize Christ as "the light to the revelation of the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32) from the Gospel of the day.

We begin the Mass by blessing candles and then processing into the church. You are welcome to bring candles from your home to be blessed. We'll have tables available in the narthex of each church for you to drop off your candles prior to the beginning of Mass. Please bring candles in a box with your name on them for easy pick up after Mass.

Saint Blaise Blessing - On the Feast of Saint Blaise, February 3, there is a traditional blessing of throats. In anticipation, the priests will offer the blessing on Feb 1 & 2 during the recessional following each Mass. The blessing will then be celebrated again at the conclusion of Mass on Monday, Feb. 3.



VOTIVE MASS OF THE SACRED HEART

On Friday February 7th at 6:00 PM, we will celebrate a Votive Mass of the Sacred Heart in honor of Servant of God, Frank Parater, at Saint Patrick. February 7th is the day of Frank Parater's death, who had a strong devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Mass will feature a professional quartet of singers, to assist in the celebration. Please join us for this special Mass as we pray for the intercession of Frank Parater and work to further the cause for his canonization.

COMMUNITY NEWS

Recently, the Holy Father inaugurated a new Holy Year of Hope. In his comments he offered the following: "during the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind" (<u>Spes non confundit</u>, 10). He noted how indulgenced works are linked to certain works of mercy and penance, which bear witness to the conversion undertaken.

The faithful, following the example and mandate of Christ, are encouraged to carry out works of charity or mercy more frequently, especially in the service of those brothers and sisters who are burdened by various needs. More especially, they should rediscover these "corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead" (*Misericordiae vultus*, 15) and rediscover also "the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead" (*ibid*.)."

In the midst of our work in the community, don't forget how your assistance can help purify your own soul and those who have gone before us.

Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day (cf. Enchiridion Indulgentiarum, IV ed., norm. 18, § 1), the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in Purgatory, if they receive Holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, applicable only to the deceased (this must take place within a Eucharistic celebration; see can. 917 and the Pontifical Commission for the authentic interpretation of the CIC, Responsa ad dubia, 1, 11 July 1984). Through this double act, a praiseworthy exercise of supernatural charity is carried out, through that bond by which the faithful still journeying on this earth are united in the mystical Body of Christ, with those who have already completed their journey, by virtue of the fact that "the Jubilee indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy" (Spes non confundit, 22) (Decree on the Granting of the Indulgence during the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025, III).

Annual Saint Patrick Festival

As many know, the annual Saint Patrick Festival is held every year *near* the Feast Day. The Festival supports Saint Patrick parish and a host of other churches and entities throughout the Richmond area, to include her sister parishes of the Pro-Cathedral of Saint Peter and Saint John.

This year, the Festival will be held the weekend of **Saturday-Sunday**, **March 15-16**. Last year, we had generous volunteer participation from parishioners from all three parishes, that prompted generous contributions from the proceeds of the Festival to all three communities.

This year, we would love to have additional participation from all three parishes to make this year's festival a resounding success.

Recientemente, el Santo Padre inauguró un nuevo Año Santo de la Esperanza. En sus comentarios, ofreció lo siguiente: "durante el Año Santo, estamos llamados a ser signos tangibles de esperanza para aquellos de nuestros hermanos y hermanas que experimentan dificultades de cualquier tipo" (Spes non confundit, 10). Señaló cómo las obras con indulgencia están vinculadas a ciertas obras de misericordia y penitencia, las cuales dan testimonio de la conversión emprendida.

Los fieles, siguiendo el ejemplo y mandato de Cristo, son alentados a realizar obras de caridad o misericordia con mayor frecuencia, especialmente al servicio de aquellos hermanos y hermanas que están agobiados por diversas necesidades. Más especialmente, deberían redescubrir estas "obras corporales de misericordia: dar de comer al hambriento, dar de beber al sediento, vestir al desnudo, acoger al extranjero, curar a los enfermos, visitar a los presos y enterrar a los muertos" (Misericordiae vultus, 15) y redescubrir también "las obras espirituales de misericordia: aconsejar a los que tienen dudas, instruir a los ignorantes, amonestar a los pecadores, consolar a los afligidos, perdonar las ofensas, sufrir con paciencia los males que nos hagan, y orar por los vivos y los muertos" (ibíd.).

En medio de nuestro trabajo en la comunidad, no olvidemos cómo nuestra asistencia puede ayudar a purificar nuestra propia alma y las de aquellos que nos precedieron.

A pesar de la norma que establece que solo se puede obtener una indulgencia plenaria por día (cf. Enchiridion Indulgentiarum, IV ed., norm. 18, § 1), los fieles que hayan realizado un acto de caridad en favor de las almas del Purgatorio, si reciben la Santa Comunión una segunda vez ese día, pueden obtener la indulgencia plenaria dos veces en el mismo día, aplicable únicamente a los difuntos (esto debe ocurrir dentro de una celebración eucarística; véase can. 917 y la Comisión Pontificia para la interpretación auténtica del CIC, Responsa ad dubia, 1, 11 de julio de 1984). A través de este doble acto, se realiza un ejercicio loable de caridad sobrenatural, mediante ese vínculo por el cual los fieles que aún peregrinan en esta tierra se unen en el Cuerpo Místico de Cristo con aquellos que ya han completado su camino, en virtud de que "la indulgencia jubilar, gracias al poder de la oración, está destinada de manera particular a aquellos que nos han precedido, para que puedan obtener la misericordia plena" (Spes non confundit, 22) (Decreto sobre la concesión de la indulgencia durante el Año Jubilar Ordinario 2025, III).

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK & SAINT JOHN

This weekend at St. Patrick's, the communion motet is a soprano duet titled "Peace to You," a citation from St. John's Gospel [20:21-22].

Peace to you, my peace be with you. As the Father sent me, now I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit. My peace I give to you, now and forever. Amen.

This modern composition, scored for two sopranos, is a meditation on the Gospel account of Jesus appearing to His disciples. Through the calm and clarifying harmonies, this soprano duet paints a pastoral picture of the peace of Christ. Towards the end, the piece reaches its zenith on the most satisfying and consonant harmony at the word "peace," and from there, begins its descent to a restful end. Consider the commentary on this passage of Jesus appearing after the resurrection to his disciples, by Catholic author Pierre-Marie Dumont: "The Lord begins by restoring peace to the frightened hearts of his Apostles: 'Peace be with you!'—the traditional Jewish greeting, Shalom alekhem. Yet, in the mouth of the Risen Jesus, this is not just a kindly salutation; it is an immediately effective word: peace is literally given to the Apostles. Jesus had said as much in his farewell discourse: 'My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives it do I give it to you' (Jn 14:27). The peace of Jesus is a divine gift: it is his presence—dwelling forever among his own—that gives it."

In the proceeding verse [23], Jesus institutes the Sacrament of Confession, "whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

As the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity concludes, let us pray that all Christians may find true peace in the presence of Christ.


Campaña Diocesana Anual 2025:


