Since we are secular, i.e., we live “in the world,” it can be difficult to orient our hearts and our daily lives to our “citizenship in heaven,” as articulated by St. Paul.

A focus for families: our first task is to introduce and cultivate a personal relationship with the Lord and personal responsibility in the Church among our family members. Our task is to promote holiness of life - to make saints of our family members. Home is heaven, lived incarnationally in the family home.

A key for single people: develop friends among the “saints,” and develop a “mission field” in your sphere of influence. Your Gospel image: “I have no place to rest my head, just like the Lord.”

For the working person: Everyone in my sphere of influence knows I am a practicing Catholic in need of redemption, the Gospel message is my frame of reference for how I apply myself to my daily tasks.

MUSIC AT SAINT PATRICK AND SAINT JOHN

Continuing in our discussion of the Order of Mass, the conclusion of the Liturgy of the Word includes Gospel Acclamation, Gospel reading, Homily, Creed, Universal Prayer. The Gospel Acclamation is sung "Alleluia," or if during Lent, an alternative acclamation (ex. Praise and honor to you, Lord Jesus Christ). Many times in the liturgy, music has a functional use in addition to an adorning one. The General Instruction describes this acclamation as a rite "by which the assembly of the faithful welcomes and greets the Lord who is about to speak to it in the Gospel and professes its faith by means of the chant." The text of the Gospel Acclamation verse, which "is sung either by the choir or by the cantor," is usually a prominent citation from the Gospel reading itself.

The musical element that concludes the Liturgy of the Word is the Creed. There are four main chant versions of the Nicene Creed (numbered I-IV). The version that the priest sees in the Missal on the altar is in english or latin, Creed (or Credo, meaning "I believe" in latin), I.
