THE PASTOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL PÁRROCO

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, we have the opportunity to reflect upon the precious gift that Our Lord has granted us in being able to *encounter Him* through the sacramental signs of bread and wine. I'm reminded of a reflection from Pope Benedict XVI, during a homily on this Feast in 2006:

On the feast of Corpus Christi we especially look at the sign of bread. It reminds us of the pilgrimage of Israel during the 40 years in the desert. The Host is our manna whereby the Lord nourishes us - it is truly the bread of heaven, through which he gives himself. In the procession we follow this sign and in this way we follow Christ himself. And we ask of him: Guide us on the paths of our history! Show the Church and her Pastors again and again the right path! Look at suffering humanity, cautiously seeking a way through so much doubt; look upon the physical and mental hunger that torments it! Give men and women bread for body and soul! Give them work! Give them light! Give them yourself! Purify and sanctify all of us! Make us understand that only through participation in your Passion, through "yes" to the cross, to self-denial, to the purifications that you impose upon us, our lives can mature and arrive at true fulfilment. Gather us together from all corners of the earth. Unite your Church, unite wounded humanity! Give us your salvation! Amen.


Lord, help us to say "Yes" to you daily, regardless of the circumstances. Please be assured of my prayers this week.

En la fiesta del Corpus Christi, tenemos la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre el precioso don que Nuestro Señor nos ha concedido al poder *encontrarlo* a través de los signos sacramentales del pan y el vino. Recuerdo una reflexión del Papa Benedicto XVI, durante una homilía en esta fiesta en 2006:

En la fiesta del Corpus Christi, contemplamos especialmente el signo del pan. Nos recuerda la peregrinación de Israel durante los 40 años en el desierto. La Hostia es nuestro maná con el que el Señor nos nutre; es verdaderamente el pan del cielo, a través del cual se entrega. En la procesión seguimos este signo y así seguimos a Cristo mismo. Y le pedimos: ¡Guíanos por los caminos de nuestra historia! ¡Muestra a la Iglesia y a sus pastores una y otra vez el camino correcto! Mira a la humanidad sufriente, que busca con cautela un camino entre tantas dudas; mira el hambre física y mental que la atormenta. ¡Dales a los hombres y mujeres pan para el cuerpo y el alma! ¡Dales trabajo! ¡Dales luz! ¡Dales tú mismo! ¡Purifícanos y santifícanos a todos! Haznos comprender que solo participando en tu Pasión, aceptando la cruz, la abnegación y las purificaciones que nos impones, nuestras vidas pueden madurar y alcanzar la verdadera plenitud. Reúnenos desde todos los rincones de la tierra. ¡Une a tu Iglesia, une a la humanidad herida! ¡Danos tu salvación! Amén.


