THE ADMINISTRATOR'S WEEKLY REFLECTION/ REFLEXIÓN SEMANAL DEL ADMINISTRATOR

In the Gospel this Sunday, Jesus reminds us not to place our trust in material wealth, but to be “rich in what matters to God.” The rich man’s plans revolved around comfort and possessions, yet he was unprepared to meet the Lord. In this Jubilee Year, we are called to re-center our lives—not on what we own—but on who we are before God. This is especially meaningful as I and some of our parishioners will make a pilgrimage to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. on August 5, 2025. After that, I will go to Italy to join with other pilgrims to do Jubilee Pilgrimage. These sacred pilgrimages are not just travels, but spiritual opportunities to let go of worldly attachments and to deepen our trust in God’s mercy.

The Jubilee Year is a time of grace, of forgiveness and of renewal. It is a reminder that this life is temporary, and eternity is what truly matters. Like pilgrims on the road, we are all travelers toward our heavenly home. May these pilgrimages—both near and far—help us reawaken our faith, rediscover the simplicity of our hearts, and return with a spirit of generosity and peace. Please pray for all of us on this journey, that our hearts may be open to the treasures that only God can give.

En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús nos recuerda que no debemos poner nuestra confianza en las riquezas materiales, sino ser “ricos ante Dios”. Los planes del hombre rico giraban en torno a la comodidad y las posesiones, pero no estaba preparado para encontrarse con el Señor. En este Año Jubilar, estamos llamados a recentrar nuestras vidas, no en lo que poseemos, sino en quiénes somos ante Dios. Esto cobra un significado especial ya que algunos feligreses y yo haremos una peregrinación a la Basílica del Santuario Nacional de la Inmaculada Concepción en Washington, D.C., el 5 de agosto de 2025. Después de eso, viajaré a Italia para unirme a otros peregrinos y realizar la Peregrinación Jubilar. Estas peregrinaciones sagradas no son solo viajes, sino oportunidades espirituales para desprendernos de los apegos mundanos y profundizar nuestra confianza en la misericordia de Dios.

The communion antiphon for this Sunday (above) reflects the message that our Lord has for us in the Gospel – store up riches in heaven, not on earth. Take notice of what God considers riches versus what we do. The description of the petition in the opening collect prayer for Mass – *that, for those who glory in you as their Creator and guide* – puts our desire for heavenly riches in perspective, through describing our intended worship of God. We ask God to remember his promises to us, which includes the promise that he will be truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, which we may reflect on, as “endowed with all delights and sweetness” as the choir sings the antiphon this weekend.

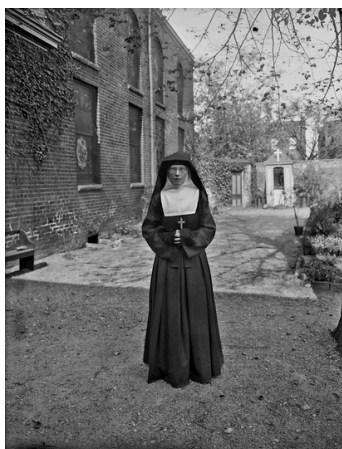

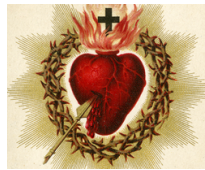
